Violet Dreschfeld (also known as Dressfield or Dressfeld) was a sculptor and life-long friend of Beatrice's. The daughter of an academic, she was born in Manchester in 1890. She studied in London in 1915, when Beatrice was also there, before moving to Paris and working from a studio at Montparnasse. In later life she lived and worked for many years on the island of Mallorca. This may explain the Spanish title; 'La Gitana' translates as 'The Gypsy'. Beatrice and Violet remained friends and correspondents and Beatrice was to paint her again some decades later (cat.47).

There is an example of Violet Dreschfeld's sculpture in the collection (cat.84).
